The 25 cent value has been noted with the missing C in Canada, Nick discovered some in the 2,500,000 range and I found some in the 3,903,000 range. See below.

## S11 - A MOST INTERESTING ISSUE...

While working on the High Low list for the S11 issue I came across an unusual item. The S11-F has replacements in the 1982xxx range and the High Q variety above the replacement range. The coupons above 2000000 are normal again.

What I have is a coupon in the range just before the replacements and from the image you will note that the figure 8 in the serial number on the right side appears smaller than the other 8 in the serial number on the same side. If my perception of this is correct then that could very well be a reason why there are replacements in the 198xxxx range. It appears that the numbering equipment became defective in this range and that is why the small 8.(See Fig 1)

I suspect that the last 8 would appear smaller for at least all of the 19807xx range. Any numbers with the small 8 found in this range would confirm this. So how many are there? My guess is at least 10 but most likely more.

I would like either a photocopy, scans sent by Email or the actual coupon to bracket the numbers for the High Low list for the \$1.00 value. Numbers needed will be between 1980000 to 2000000. Replacement coupon numbers for all the other values and in any range would also be helpful in compiling the High/Low list. (Jake's 2nd lucky #217) I am also prepared to purchase any available replacement notes in this issue to achieve this goal.

This involves a range of some 20,000 coupons to study. Your contributions or info on this would be appreciated.
