ANOTHER MINOR VARIETY!

While looking through some new coupons at one of the many CTC stores that I visit, I happened upon a CTC S22-G 2.00 coupon with a print imperfection. Check the scan below. It is not unusual to find something similar on a 10¢ or another denomination, but on a 2.00 note, I must admit is pretty rare.

Even rarer for this type of print imperfection is the fact that it was on close to 700 coupons. This type of blotch

usually disappears soon because the dirt on the printing plate falls off or sticks to a sheet.

In the range of 1000 that I had the luck to be going through around coupon #4043 it appeared to disappear around #4232 which means that there were 180 with this defect. While continuing to search through the rest it again appeared around #4475 and went almost to the end of the thousand at #4975. This would mean that there are

at least 680 in circulation and there could be more in the subsequent bundles.

For those of you who prefer the thrill of the hunt. I did not remove them all from circulation, so it is possible that they could go through the system and end up at your store.

I know that this can happen because I marked a coupon while checking coupons in one store and it went through the system and came back 200 kilometers away and it did this in less than 6 months. The coupon was in a batch that was being returned to the Corporation for redemption by a store. When I saw it the next time it was in a batch that was received by a Gas Bar for distribution.



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
