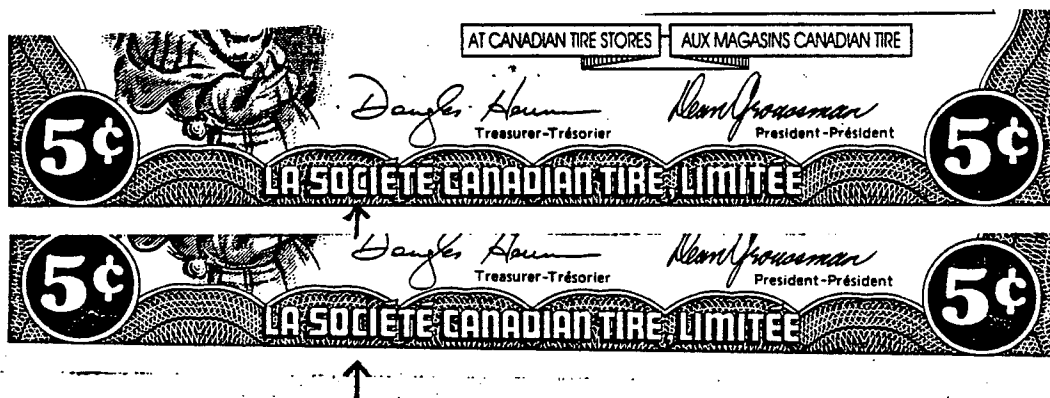


## ROLLY'S DISCOVERY

These are the Bilodeau CTC-S 8 A,B & D or the Charlton CT- 27-6,27-2, 27-4. He has found only the 5¢, 10¢ and 50¢ coupons have the variety, which consists of a "plugged" C in the word "SOCIETE" at the bottom of the obverse. Not rare, they make an easy to collect set, as well as, sharpening your skills in finding other similar errors on the coupons. Rolly has found that the normal ones are scarcer than the plugged. ## MIKE'S DISCOVERY

Even your old president got into the discovery business this summer while preparing an article for the Canadian Coin News. He was looking at the Home Made issues of the CTC. These are the ones that were printed by the CTC, not either of the banknote companies. He was describing the reverse of the coupons and wrote that the gas bar pictured on the coupon didn't have the name "Mor-Power" on it. He found that an interesting omission since the CTC were using the Mor-Power name at this time. When he looked at the picture in my book the name Mor-Power was there! It would appear at this time that only the 3¢ coupons are involved. We hope to publish some figures for you next newsletter. If you have a hoard of coupons send in your results. These should also be noted in the catalogue. In the CT-2, CT-3 and CT-4 series the words MOR POWER GAS on the store sign at lower left value counter tablet is missing on some issues. I am assigning a temporary number to these as follows.

CT-3-4a	3c	C	Orange
CT-3-12a	3c	X	Black
CT-3-13a	3c	Y	Black
CT-4-1a	3c		Orange
