Gas Bar CTC-7 "Narrow Font" ranges

As with all printing of Canadian Tire coupons, nothing is very consistent for long, and this is **good** for us collectors! An example of this occurs during the Gas Bar CTC 7 – the green series, through denominations 5c to 30c. Although very subtle, there is a range of "Narrow Font" serial numbered coupons in each of the six denominations listed above. As all of these notes were printed by the British American Banknote Company, the decision to use a different font or number style head must have been internal, and did not last that long before switching back, as the number of notes printed with the narrow font varies buy the popularity of the denomination. The 5c, 10c, and 25c had many more narrow font coupons than the 15c, 20c, and 30c notes. Approximate ranges based on "framing" notes are listed in this article by denomination. (As you can see from the chart, the 5c, 10c, and 25c ranges are much closer than the 15c, 20c, and 30c ranges.)

Another unusual thing about this series is that the 25¢ denomination has several short runs of regular or wider font notes within the narrow font ranges, while all the other denominations seem to have had a straight uninterrupted run of these narrow font notes. Therefore, in the case of the 25¢ denomination, it can be concluded that both regular and narrow font serial numbered heads were used to print the sheets, whereas in all the other denominations, only the narrow font serial numbered heads were used.

^{**} From the C26378nn series to the C28028nn series, notes seem to be of the normal or wider font. I have found only one narrow font coupon in the C2802nnn series which may indicate that this particular example is a replacement note. Also, if you look through the examples of the "framer" notes, in most cases the serial numbers are in the 900 range which may indicate that only one regular or wider font head on the sheet was used!?! I have not found any other narrow font 25¢ coupons after the C2802nnn series.

Gas Bar CTC-7 "Narrow Font" ranges... cont'd

To some collectors, these notes are difficult to spot. Check your coupons in the ranges listed above and compare them to coupons outside the low/high ranges. The British American Banknote Company used the narrow font serial number heads when printing the 1954 Bank of Canada currency. Compare any BABN 1954 currency with any 1954 Canadian Banknote Company note and you can see the difference too!

There maybe other denominations containing the narrow font coupons higher than 30ϕ , but I have not seen any. As we do not see that many 35ϕ to 60ϕ (exception 50ϕ) I can't confirm they do not exist, but it is unlikely. It is interesting that none have been found in the 50ϕ CTC 7 "M" prefix, as these were also green and printed about the same time.

If any members can add to any of the above with other information, ranges or denominations, please write to me. I am especially interested in narrowing down the "start/low" numbered coupons, and the "end/high" numbered coupons in the 15ϕ , 20ϕ , and 30ϕ ranges. Also any regular, or wider font "framer" coupons either higher or lower than what is in the chart will also help narrow down how many narrow font notes exist in each denomination.

I realize that the difference between the regular wider font, and the narrow font is slight, but there is a definite difference!
