75TH ANNIVERSARY \$2.00 REPLACEMENT COUPON - CTC S-19AA

As we all know, \$2.00 replacement coupons are hard to find, probably the hardest of any denomination simply because they are the least printed.

A good example of this is the recent 75th anniversary series CTC S-19A in which only one million 2 dollar coupons were made All have now been issued and as we all know the "175" replacements have been very hard to find, with only a "handful" actually acknowledged.

To try and establish actual serial numbers printed vs actual numbers used and issued to try and determine rarity, I have been asking several of our members who have an example of this "175" \$2.00 coupon in their collection for their serial numbers, and the result is as follows in numerical order from low number to high:

13617, 13684, 13829, 13830, 13834, 13866, 13978, 14001

As you can see, the few that we know of are mostly in the high thirteen thousand range with one over fourteen thousand. Were there 14,000+ replacements printed by the British American Bank Note Company? If so, where are all the others? Are there any in other serial number ranges

found? Did B.A.B.N.C. elect to only use a "few" in lieu of reprinting actual destroyed serial numbered coupons for other errors that occurred, or did they just simply not make very many errors in the printing of this \$2.00 series?

To try and get more information on this elusive coupon, I need your help!

If you have an example of this "175" \$2.00 coupon, series CTC S-19Aa and the serial number of your note is not listed above, please write to me or call me with the number(s) of your replacement coupon(s). Even if it is in the range above, please let me know so we can get a feeling of how many have actually been found. As you can see, not too many so far!

We have established the actual number of regular coupons printed at one million, but only research, and your help will establish some idea of how many replacements were used. Your input would be greatly appreciated.
