## **CANADIAN TIRE LAUNCHES LIMITED EDITION \$1 CANADIAN TIRE MONEY COIN**

TORONTO - Canadian Tire money is getting a new coin, the famous multicoloured bills considered by many as the country's unofficial second currency to be joined by the \$1 piece for a limited time.

Canadian Tire announced Wednesday December 2nd that it will begin offering customers the new addition to its half-century-old Canadian Tire Money reward points this weekend. The company says it will hand out the dollar coins to customers who spend \$25 or more at Canadian Tire this Saturday and Sunday the 5th and 6th of December. The move puts an end to speculation that Canadian Tire was ready to eliminate its popular paper money loyalty program.



The "money," which can be used like cash only at Canadian Tire stores and gas bars, was previously available only in bill form in denominations from 5¢ to \$2, all stamped with the grinning image of Sandy McTire, the company's fictional mascot.

Canada's largest hard goods retailer said it plans to launch a new loyalty program by the end of next year intended to target consumers' shopping habits more closely, though it still plans to keep the traditional money in circulation.

Canadian Tire money launched in 1958, and has since expanded to include electronic currency on the company's branded credit cards.

Canadian Tire has more than 1,200 stores and gas stations and employs 57,000 workers across the country.



The coin was created by the Royal Canadian Mint and was struck in nickel-plated, multi-ply steel blanks and has a diameter of 30 mm. Nearly two million coins were struck, along with 9,000 brass plated tokens for presentation to CTC staff. About 1000 were encased in Lucite and given to store owners.
